Brothers,

I hope this newsletter finds you all doing well as the year roars by and into the holiday season. For the benefit of those who don't know me, I am, as of this past June, the alumni association president. Previously I was the vice president and before that served on the executive board, including during the exciting recolonization of our chapter in 2002.

From my observations of the undergraduate chapter, things are definitely looking up; however, challenges remain. Because the chapter is, among other things, "active" (both internally and on campus), I think it is one of which all alumni can be proud, and the type of house we would like to join ourselves or have our sons join.

The alumni association is, and has been, committed to providing a safe environment for our undergraduate members, allowing them to have the fraternal experiences we would all wish for them, while still allowing them the independence to run and maintain the physical structure. This type of opportunity is unparalleled for most college students who are not members of Greek organizations, and is an excellent way for today's Theta-Pi Zeta members to learn and practice self reliance and leadership.

Many of you already know that within the next several years, all fraternities at Gettysburg will be required to install sprinkler and fire-alarm systems to protect the lives of the undergraduate brothers and their guests, pursuant to the Life Safety Initiative (LSI). Preliminary estimates are in excess of \$100,000, which, while certainly not a small amount, is far less than what many other chapters on campus will be required to expend to comply with new Commonwealth of Pennsylvania standards. A major campaign to raise the funds for this and other capital improvements to the house should get into full swing during 2006. Keep checking for updates on this important process that is designed to ensure a safe legacy for us on the Gettysburg College campus.

I am pleased to serve as president of this organization and am always open to suggestions from fellow brothers. 2005 Alumni Weekend a Success

The classes of 1960 and 1965 had the largest contingents, with 10-12 brothers from each.

One Future." — was certainly appropriate as alumni brothers recalled stories of Theta-Pi from when they were attending Gettysburg College and living in the house.

the chapter's successes today. Also, **Mark Trudeau '92** and **Gregg Padovano '93** informed all present of Gettysburg College's Life Safety Initiative, which represents an important step in protecting our undergraduate brothers in the future.

Gregg Padovano stepped down as president after having led Theta-Pi through a successful recolonization and planting the seeds for the continued success of the chapter. Gregg will remain involved with the board as the immediate past president. Mark Trudeau has assumed the presidency, while **Troy Cassel '02** will take on the challenges of vice president. **Chris Nonas '94** and **Douglas Walo '03** will continue as treasurer and secretary, respectively.

The Fraternity Is in Good Hands

Fall 2005 brought exciting changes to Theta-Pi Zeta, while also upholding the fraternity's commitment to excellence in academics, integrity and brotherly love.

Evidence that the fall would be successful was first seen this summer. Over a weekend in July, several undergraduate brothers, alumni and parents gathered at the house for a work weekend, organized by house manager David Gibbons. Among the major projects, we installed two lampposts on the front lawn to give

peace of mind to brothers and their friends. We have received compliments both from neighbors and the Safety and Security Office about the lights, since

our section of Broadway Street is rather dark. The basement was another scene of improvement — it was painted green and white with gold trim.

There were light moments to the weekend as well. Several brothers had been working for hours, digging a trench for the electrical wires for the lamps, when senior brother Rick Bartol showed up. In no time at all, Rick "The Body" Bartol had grabbed a shovel and dug that trench.

The weekend also was sad in that it was the last opportunity, at least for a year or two, for the brothers to see recent graduate Aaron Dilliplane '05, who departed in July to spend up to two years teaching English in Japan. (He has been joined by Joseph Susco '05.)

As soon as the brothers had moved back into the house, it seemed like rush was upon us. Thanks to the efforts of all brothers, but in particular our high delta, Kellen Dwyer, rush week was a tremendous success. On September 11, 19 young men took the oath of associate membership, and on October 22 they were initiated. The excellence of these young men is high. They come from various backgrounds (including as far away as California), majors (from biochemistry to film studies) and extracurricular activities (CAB, Cheers, track, student senate and many more), but they all have one thing in common: a commitment to the ideals of Lambda Chi Alpha.

Not to be outdone by their younger brothers, the upperclassmen continue to be leaders in campus life and in the classroom. Senior Kellen Dwyer received a score of 175 out of 180 (99th percentile) on his LSAT this June. He is currently applying to law schools such as Yale, Harvard and Stanford. Seniors David Crumplar and I are candidates for the Fulbright Scholarship sponsored by the U.S. Department of State. Junior Jeremy Meehan and sophomore Geoffrey Crampton were elected president and vice president of the IFC, respectively.

Community service continues to be a hallmark of the Theta-Pi Zeta experience. In addition to participating on their own (such as with after-school tutoring), brothers joined together for the fraternity's third annual 24-Hour Teeter-Totter-a-Thon (co-sponsored with Chi Omega), which proved to be a great success. In addition, the fraternity sponsored a neighborhood community workday for which the brothers helped neighbors with chores. We also participated in Habitat for Humanity and other Greek organizations' community service events.

Fraternity-wide elections are to be held soon. Regardless of who is selected for office, it can be said with confidence that each office, like the fraternity as a whole, is in good hands. At this time next year, the house will be different, the current seniors will have left us and new brothers will have joined. One thing will remain certain: The brothers of Theta-Pi Zeta will continue to "believe in the traditions, principles and ideals" of Lambda Chi Alpha.

Moment in History

Remarks by **Donald F. Lybarger '19** on the occasion of the burning of the mortgage on March 15, 1958:

"I could tell much concerning the early days of the chapter and yet not convey to you an appreciation of the spirit which animated the founders and those who came after them. I am convinced that the real secret of our success in the chapter was founded in an unfailing friendship which manifested itself through unselfish service. There was loyalty, goodwill and a readiness to share burdens as well as benefits.

"At the start we had no well-known fraternity name, no large body of alumni, no wealth, no house in which to live. We demonstrated, nonetheless, what the founders of the fraternity system many generations ago had shown — namely, that a true fraternity is not built of brick and mortar, but is a thing of the spirit which lives in the hearts of its members."
