

CHAPTER NEWS

Theta-Pi Outpaces Other Chapters in Academics, Philanthropy and Recruitment

Congratulations to our undergraduate chapter for achieving the highest GPA among 11 Gettysburg fraternities for the spring 2009 semester. Lambda Chi achieved a 3.288 GPA in the spring. The second highest rank, achieved by Sigma Chi, was 3.084.

Lambda Chi also has the second largest membership among campus fraternities with 59 actives, behind Phi Sig's 64-man membership.

In terms of philanthropy, Lambda Chi's monetary contributions far outweighed other campus fraternities. Theta-Pi contributed \$8,750 and 383 hours of service toward the overall total of \$29,408.26 and 1,312 service hours by Gettysburg fraternities. In addition, Lambda Chi also contributed 3,500 pounds of food to the local food bank.


Donor Generosity Yields All-time Best Annual Giving
