Theta Pi has been very active this year. Wrapping up from last spring, the chapter raised 1,400 lbs of food and over \$600 for the North American Food Drive. We also donated many service hours to yard work in local communities and mentored in the El Centro and LEAP programs. In the end, Theta Pi had over 600 community service hours spread out over 22 different opportunities, including on campus as well as in the residential community.

down with the brothers and ask us questions. One of the most exciting events was a dodge ball tournament, which is always a favorite. Men were also invited to a date function where they had the opportunity to bring a friend over to the chapter house and socialize with brothers and their dates. There were also several other opportunities to get to know the brothers by coming over to the house. By the end of the process, we gained 25 associate members.

The AM class has a remarkably high GPA and is also very involved on campus. Their activities include many varsity sports including soccer, baseball, football, lacrosse, and swimming. Other sports include club hockey and rugby. The AMs are also involved on the Campus Activities Board, Mock Trial, Law and Justice Society, the Pre Health Professions club, Residence Life, and many other organizations on campus. The brothers of Theta Pi are confident that our new members will uphold the values of Lambda Chi Alpha and will be active and contributing members of our organization.

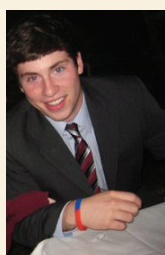
UNDERGRADUATE Q&A
