Staying Involved With Gettysburg Years after Graduation Rob Blomberg '76 is Impressed with How Brothers Treat(ed) Each Other

Thank you to **Rob Blomberg** '76 for participating in this Q&A...

Why did you join Lambda Chi as an undergraduate? Many of my freshman friends were interested in Lambda Chi, so I got to know many of the brothers well and liked them. Lambda Chi was rebuilding and I liked the idea of being part of a fraternity that was establishing a new identity.

What is your most memorable moment from your Lambda Chi days? That is probably winning the intramural soccer championship against TKE in the fall of 1975 during my senior year. The previous year we had lost to them in the finals in triple overtime in a heartbreaking game. We came back and beat them senior year for the championship.

What is your fondest Lambda Chi

memory? Probably the story I've told most often is the "Battlefield Tour," which no longer occurs. It brought our freshman class together as it did subsequent classes, plus it was a lot of fun.

Dan Selak '60 Explains How the Integrity and Characters of Brothers Makes Him Proud

Thank you to Dan Selak '60 for participating in this Q&A...

Why did you join Lambda Chi as an undergraduate? It was an outstanding group of individuals and the one fraternity that I felt most compatible with at Gettysburg. I felt at home when I was there, and I still do to this day.

What is the single fondest memory you have shared/will share with your children and grandchildren? One of the things that I always enjoyed was the Christmas decorating contest. My senior year we did it with a chipmunk song, which hearing it over and over became quite annoying, but we won so it was worth it. It was a lot of fun and camaraderie. For the singing competition we did the Russian Volga Boat song and sang it in Russian and won.

What about your membership in Lambda

Chi makes you the most proud? The integrity that Lambda Chi brothers had and still have and the character of the people make me proud. At the time, we were one of the leaders when it came to volunteering and taking care of one another.

How would your life be different today if you had never joined Lambda Chi? It's difficult to say because college and Lambda Chi are all rolled into one, but a combination of the two gave me the confidence to spread my wings and develop. I came from a humble background with little money so I had to work my way through college, often holding multiple jobs at a time which gave me the back bone I needed to have success in life. It was an invaluable lesson for a young man.

Where has life taken you since graduation? What's new in your life today? When I graduated from college in 1960, I volunteered for the Navy and became

a carrier pilot and flew for seven years. Then I became a flight instructor. After that I moved to Los Angeles as a Continental pilot and ended up becoming a stock broker becoming an assistant manager, then manager, then complex manager in several different offices. My biggest office was in Beverly Hills with Smith Barney, but I also had my own clientele. I retired at age 66 and became a financial consultant for attorneys on securities cases as an expert witness. I still consult, relying on my 40 plus years of experienc,e and testify in court.
