

- Complete social networking integration with Facebook and LinkedIn, allowing you to have a one-stop browsing experience if desired.



Lambda Chi Boasts Top GPA and Greek Men of the Year

Brothers Recognized at Gettysburg Greek Awards, Contribute Time and Money for Community Service

Theta-Pi has a lot to be proud of this year. Academically, we are among the top fraternities on campus, ranking first in grades last fall (3.21 GPA) and second this past spring (3.16). We were recognized for our #1 fall 2012 GPA at last year's campus Greek awards. Our academic success can be credited to internal reviews of GPA and programs run by our scholastic chair to encourage and reward high marks.

Also at the Gettysburg Greek awards,

two individual brothers received recognition. Shane Swink was named Greek Man of the Year for the senior class, and current President Andrew Bellis was named Greek Man of the Year for the junior class.
